JSC v.3-1620-01 Lloydtown

- Main Street, Lloydtown and Doyle's Hotel
- named after Jesse Lloyd

JSC v.3-1620-02 Lukes, Sam Mill

- flower mill built after fire, May 5 1923

JSC v.3-1620-03 McArthur's Barn

- photo taken in 1932
- 2 copies

JSC v.3-1620-04 McKinsty's, Roberts Blacksmith and Garage shop

- photo taken in 1934

JSC v.3-1620-05 McVety Home

- 49 John Street, East Bradford Ontario
- 2 copies

JSC v.3-1620-06 Model School

- constructed in 1879 to replace the building that burned down
- torn down in 1952

JSC v.3-1620-07 Nesbitt, J.E.

- early auto dealer – Overland Automobile dealers

- article from Sunday April 23, 1989
- Playter House was built in 1880

- later known as Bingham's Hotel in 1854

JSC v.3-1620-17 Tenth Line Presbyterian Church

- in King township
- erected in 1883

JSC v.3-1620-18 Toll Gate

- between Holland Landing and Bradford
- 8 copies

JSC v.3-1620-19 "Town eyesore once a splendid mansion"

- article from February 12, 1992 on The Old Convent
- 1 original, 1 copy

- "94 Years in Bradford and a mill comes tumbling down"

- caught fire twice: May 5, 1923 and November 14, 1966
