regarding them. Sgt. Wilson joined the Air Force on March 19, 1943, and received his training at Montreal, Quebec City and Mont Joli, graduating from the latter in September of last year. He went overseas during the first week of October and since Christmas had

been taking part in regular air oper-Wilson told of the regular receipt of cigarettes from the Bradford Canadian Corps and of The Witness. He also told in his last letter of visiting his mother's family, his grandmother, in
