

Another Successful Year for the Bradford Fair.

Fully 3,000 People Present the last day.

The Directors of the Agricultural Society may congratulate themselves on the fact that the Exhibition this year was a good one.

The entries were in advance of last year, the attendance greater, and the finances better.

The heavy rain storm Tuesday morning caused gloomy forebodings, but the weather that followed was exceptionally fine and a fine Wednesday was an ideal fair day.

A more orderly crowd of people was seldom seen at a Fair, and we do not know of a single casualty to report.

There were refreshment stands galore, and everything to be had in the fruit line to tickle the palate of even the most fastidious person.

The team Merry-go-Round provided amusement in abundance for the little people. Other attractions to draw the dimes out of the pockets were scattered about the grounds, such as the Cinematograph, shooting target, ring and knife game, novelty ball game, heavy weight strike, and Mame, Ethel, palmit, &c. A miniature Photographer was also doing business under canvas.

A number of fairs sought to ply their wily little games but Detective Greer who was present soon put an end to their business. It was a poor day, Wednesday, for the jugglers.

The York Rangers Battalion Band played excellent music at intervals the last two days. Everybody was delighted with their playing. On Wednesday morning a couple of lively tunes were played in front of THE WITNESS office, which was much appreciated. Mr. Quinlan the band leader.

The floral show was conspicuous by its absence.

The Hall was fairly well filled with many things that to enumerate would take more time and space than we can give this week. There was some excellent grain in considerable quantity, much good butter, and a most interesting fowl, ingeniously contrived to tempt the palate and cheat the stomach; jellies, pickles, canned fruit, etc. In roots and vegetables there were very good carrots, turnips, mangolds, immense pumpkins and squashes, fine cabbages, great onions and beautiful tomatoes. Of apples, pears, plums and grapes there was a goodly display, though we have seen larger and the quality, perhaps, could not be surpassed.

The Spectacle man had a place in the building, also the Sewing Machine agency. Oil paintings were sold for a dime. Snow was on hand with his usual very excellent display. There was a goodly array and arranged staff of Blue Ribbons. Tea and all who chose were allowed to taste. The exhibit was owned by Mr. W. Hockridge.

The Heintzman Piano Co. of Toronto, (the old firm) supplied the Upright Grand Piano in use at the concert and which was as well exhibited at the fair. It was a beautiful instrument and was much admired by the singers and Mr. J. C. Morgan, accompanist, for its richness of tone. This is the fourth year that the Heintzman Co. have supplied the piano for the Concert here and on each occasion a customer was quickly found. In the fall of 1898 Mr. W. Hockridge was a goodly chaser; in 1899, Mrs. C. Armstrong, Bradford, and this year, Mrs. Elizabeth Evans, Bradford. A similar style of piano was also shown at Cookestown Fair and used at the concert and was sold to Mrs. D. Fisher, Cookestown. Four others were sold.

The Ladies' Department and the Fine Arts Department were very good, but we cannot particularize this week. The prize list which we publish will reveal the names of the prize winners.

Outside the building, and we must necessarily be brief, there was a very good show of bugs, and many agricultural implements. The poultry exhibit was splendid, about one hundred coops of birds of all kinds and of the best breeds. Sheep, numerous and good. Swine, about ten pens. A young boar, under six months, owned by Mr. Boyes, of Churchill, and who was the first prize at Toronto and London Exhibitions attracted considerable attention. Of cattle, nothing better shown for years and about fifty head in all. The horses were excellent in their several classes and the speeding events seemed to attract the greatest crowd.

The children's procession was in an impressive sight. Some twelve schools were represented in the march. Between 400 and 500 children turned out and carried Union Jacks, banners, etc. The York Rangers Band headed the procession. Everything moved along in the best order. On the grounds being reached the speeches were made by the President of the Society, Mr. Wm. Wright, J. C. Morgan and W. Jermyn. The \$10 prize for the best turnout went to No. 4, West Gwillimbury, G. Coombs, teacher. This school had a couple of wagons nicely decorated with evergreens, flags and bunting, and was preceded by four boys on horseback. The prize for the school coming the longest distance went to Gilford, Miss Anna Rothwell, teacher.
