

MR. JAMES MCKINSTRY

A long life was terminated last Thursday in the passing of Mr. J. A. S. McKinstry at the home of his daughter, Mrs. G. Peterman. Mr. McKinstry was in his 94th year and had been in

poor health for the past two years. About four weeks before his death he was removed to Toronto General Hospital for treatment, and a week later was moved back to his daughter's home.

Born in Ireland, Mr. McKinstry came to Bradford when about three years of age, therefore he had resided—

His wife, formerly Maria Webb, predeceased him twelve years ago. Two sons predeceased him, George, who was killed overseas in the Great War, and Allan.

The funeral was held on Sunday from the residence of his daughter, Mrs. Peterman. Rev. A. G. Channen was the minister.
