

# BRADFORD'S NEW POST OFFICE



The above cut is from a recent photograph of Bradford's new Post Office building, which is now completed, with the exception of installation of the interior furnishings, the contract for which was let to the Office Specialty Co., Newmarket, some time ago. The new building is on Barrie St., on the former vacant lot immediately north of the Bank of Commerce. The contract price was \$20,000. The building will add much to the appearance of Bradford business section.

## Bradford's New Post Office Is Now Nearing Completion

Ready for Installation of Interior Fittings — Will Fill Long-Felt Need and Add Much to Appearance Of Barrie Street and Business Section

Bradford's new Post Office building, construction of which was started late last fall, is now completed, inside and out, with the exception of the installing of interior fittings, the contract for which was let some time ago.

The new building, besides filling a long-felt need in this thriving and progressive village of over 1,000 population, is a most attractive addition to Bradford's business section. It is also a credit to the architect, Gordon S. Adamson, 96 Bloor St. W., Toronto, and especially so to the general contractor, A. J. Saint, Bradford, and all other contractors in their respective lines of work. Following inspection by the government inspector, the latter stated that the workmanship throughout, without exception, was just about the finest it had ever been his privilege to inspect.

The building is of brick and tile construction, with the first floor of reinforced concrete and other floors laid on top.

The main floor has a lobby entrance with swinging doors which may be hooked back, and giving entrance to the public room, which has terazza floor with marble border and base, while the birch panelling of this room is quite striking and effective. Indirect lighting with neat, modern fixtures, gives the public room an attractive appearance.

The working space on the main floor, behind the public room, has birch floor with trimming and paneling of British Columbia fir. At the rear of this floor are men's and ladies' lavatories, also with terazza floors.

A modern caretaker's apartment on the second floor comprises kitchen, dining-room, living-room, two bedrooms with commodious clothes closets, up-to-date three-piece bathroom and an extra clothes cupboard. Floors and doors are all birch, while the kitchen has combination sink, cupboards, etc., and each room is fitted with two electric plugs. The whole apartment is absolutely up-to-date and modern in every detail.

The basement, which also has reinforced concrete floor, contains the hot water heating plant for the whole building, the balance of the space being divided into several rooms for storage purposes, all being well lighted.
