



Cooks to be honored for service to church

A special service will be held in Trinity Anglican Church, Bradford on Sunday, Oct. 22 at 10:30 a.m. to honor Mr. and Mrs. Fred Cook who have collectively served the church for 104 years.

Mr. Cook, who is also on the Bradford council, has been active in the church as Sunday school superintendent for 52 years and served on a number of area, provincial, national and international Christian Education Councils.

In 1962 he was awarded a distinctive service citation by the Department of

Christian Education, The Canadian Council of Churches.

As well as being a Sunday School teacher for two generations he conducted an active group of boys in the church for a number of years and had a Young People's Bible Class with a membership of more than 50.

Mrs. Cook joined the church choir as soon as she moved to Bradford in 1920 and has been connected with it for more than 40 years. She played the organ for

25 years straight before alternating with other organists.

As well as teaching Sunday School she has acted as treasurer for more than 10 years and at various times headed the Altar Guild, Junior and Senior Girls' Auxiliary, the Women's Auxiliary and served as an officer in the West Gwillimbury - Tecumseth Council of Christian Education.

Everyone is welcome to attend the service on Sunday to be conducted by Bishop H.R. Hunt.
