POST OFFICE INFORMATION.

LETTER RATES.

Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Province pass, if prepaid, for 5 cents per ½ oz., but if posted unpaid such letters are charged 7 cents per ½ oz.

On letters to Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward's Island, the rate is 5 cents per ½ oz., with optional prepayment.

The rate on letters to the United Kingdom is, by Canadian Packet,—

Not exceeding ½ oz..... 13½c.

Exceeding " and not over 1 oz. 25 "

" 1 oz. and not over 2 oz. 50 "

and so on, increasing 2 rates of postage for each additional oz. And by Cunard Packet, 17 cents per ½ oz., &c.

Letters for the United Kingdom must be prepaid, or they will be charged a fine of 9d. sterling on delivery.

Letters for British Colonies and Possessions beyond Sea, and Foreign Countries, via England, must be prepaid.

The rate on letters for the U. States, [except California and Oregon] 10 cts. per ½ oz.

" for Cal. and Oregon.. 15 " "

to Cuba..... 20 " "

The postage rate to British Columbia is,—

Letters..... 25 cts. per ½ oz

Newspapers..... 2 cents each.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by post from the office of publication, addressed to any place in Canada, at the following rates, if paid quarterly in advance, by either the Publisher at the post office, where the papers are posted, or by the Subscriber at the delivering post office.

For a daily paper..... 40 cents per quarter.

For a tri-weekly paper... 20 "

For a semi-weekly paper.. 15 "

For a weekly paper..... 6½ "

When the above rates are not paid in advance by either publisher or subscriber, such Papers are charged one cent each on delivery.

NEWSPAPERS BY MAIL FROM ENGLAND OR UNITED STATES.

Newspapers received from England by the Canadian Packet Mails are delivered free. Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packet Mails are charged two cents each on delivery. United States Newspapers, brought by mail into Canada, are charged one cent each on delivery.

LAW RESPECTING NEWSPAPERS.

1. Subscribers who do not give express notice to the contrary, are considered as wishing to continue their subscriptions.

2. If Subscribers order the discontinuance of their Periodicals, the Publisher may send them until all arrears are paid; and subscribers are responsible for all numbers sent.

3. If Subscribers neglect or refuse to take their periodicals from the office to which they are directed, they are held responsible till they have settled their bill, and ordered their Periodicals to be discontinued. Sending numbers back, or leaving them at the Post Office, is not such notice of discontinuance as the Law requires.

4. If Subscribers remove to other places, without informing the Publishers, and their periodicals are sent to the former directions, they are held responsible.
