It is the railway employes who suffer in these accidents. railwaymen were killed and 28 were injured in February of this year.

Where a man is responsible for his own life and the life of his companions it is probable that he will take all pre-cautions which the system allows him In 1907 in these same 10 months there were 263 men killed and 256 in-

jured. That is the average stood at 26 killed a month and 25 injured a month.

Twenty three of the deaths were due to collisions and 19 were due to derailments.
