DUNC. McARTHUR BRUTALLY ASSAULTED AND ROBBED IN HIS BOND HEAD GARAGE

Mr. Duncan McArthur, proprietor of the Bond Head garage, is a patient in York County Hospital, Newmarket, recovering from a brutal assault, committed in his garage last Friday night around 10 o'clock, when he was struck on the head and knocked to the floor, then struck again on the head and kicked about the body, before being robbed of his wallet.

According to the information gained from the O.P.P. at Alliston, who are in charge of the case, and what Mrs. McArthur learned from her husband since the assault, Mr. McArthur was alone in the garage when this stranger, said to be in his late 20's or early 30's, entered the garage and began a conversation. It was a stormy night and no one appeared to be around, so, ready to leave for home, Mr. McArthur turned to turn off the lights in the back of the garage and as he did so was struck on the head, knocking him to the floor, and before he could get to his feet more head blows and kicks to his body rendered him helpless.

His wallet was taken as was whatever the assailant used to strike Mr. McArthur.

When Mr. McArthur regained consciousness sufficiently to realize where he was and what had happened, he managed to get to his car, at the door of the garage, and drive himself the short distance to his home in the village. Mrs. McArthur heard the car come in, and the faltering steps, and went to the door and met him.

The cuts on Mr. McArthur's head are so numerous that sixty stitches were necessary to close the wounds. In addition he has broken ribs, and is bruised and hurt about the back.

The assailant did not ask for money, but rather, committed this very brutal assault and took the money.
