

# Prompt Attention Given Incorrect Sign At Bridge

August 16 issue of The Witness included an item regarding the incorrect sign on Highway 11 at the Holland River bridge, a sign which named it "Schomberg River."

George G. Johnston, M.P.P., is a subscriber to The Witness and he evidently reads the newspapers in his constituency carefully, with his mind upon the best interests of the people he represents in the Ontario Legislature. Under date of August 19 Mr. Johnston wrote your editor informing that he had cut a clipping of our article and sent it to the Honourable George H. Doucett, Minister of Highways, and informing the Minister that instructions from him would remedy the matter, adding that no sign at all was better than an incorrect one.

Mr. Doucett has been equally prompt in moving to correct an error made by someone in his department. Mr. Johnston has forwarded to this office Mr. Doucett's reply to his letter. Under date of August 22, Mr. Doucett wrote Mr. Johnston as follows: "I have your letter of August 19th and note what you say regarding the sign marking the Holland River at the bridge. I am glad you have brought this to my attention and I am asking our engineer to have this rectified."

Even the most efficient do slip up once in a while, therefore an error of this type is understandable. In this case the error is far overshadowed by the satisfaction experienced in the knowledge that our interests are so well tended by our member of Legislature, and, through him, by the departments at Queen's Park.
