

Funeral of Elder Boddy.

In our last issue we alluded to the death of Mr. A. E. Boddy, youngest son of the late Jno. Boddy, and which occurred suddenly on Sunday night, the deceased having been seized with a hemorrhage, which was superinduced from a pulmonary affection. The funeral took place on Wednesday to Mt. Pleasant cemetery and was largely attended, all the surviving members of the family, with one exception being present. Deceased was buried with Masonic honors, the brethren of Simcoe Lodge, No. 79. attending in a body. Rev. Mr. Young of the Methodist Church conducted the regular service. Undertaker Collings, who had charge of the funeral, succeeded in keeping the body in a perfect and natural state of preservation. He had the grave also nicely lined with white bleached cotton and decorated with evergreens. This, together with his lowering device made what is usually a most sorrowful scene for the mourners and brethren a pleasant and human-like way to place their brother in his last resting place.
