JSC v.3-1600-01 Armitage

- Friend's Meeting House erected in 1810 in the Quaker community of Armitage
- settlement named after Amos Armitage, part of the first Quaker's to arrive in the 1800's

JSC v.3-1600-02 "Bradford Landmark Comes Down"

- photo from The Witness, May 2 1973 of old Magani House
- former home of Bradford Mayor Joe Magani

- Klubine family farm on Hwy.11, built in 1850
- used as a Bed and Breakfast Country Guest Home

- Richard Crake's Greenview Farm one of the best for wheat growing

JSC v.3 - 1600-10 Evans Block

- located at 21 Holland Street West
- workman: Louis A. Neilly

JSC v.3-1600-11 Eversley

- Presbyterian Church interior
- Railway station

JSC v.3-1600-12 Gillies' farm

- built in the 1800's at Refferty's Corners
- burned down in the 1970's
- 1800's the house was acquired by A.B. Wells
