

MIKE KILKENNY PITCHES HIS FIRST PROFESSIONAL NO-HIT, NO-RUN GAME

Bradford's Mike Kilkenney pitched his first no-hit, no-run baseball game as a professional last Saturday night in Daytona, Florida. Pitching for the Daytona Tigers of the Florida State League, the star left-hander led his team to a 4-0 victory over the Tampa Tarpons of the same loop.

During the course of the game, Kilkenney struck out 12 batters and picked two Tarpon runners off first base with quick moves.

Following the game many fans purchased baseballs and had him autograph them while his teammates presented him with the ball he used to get the final out of the game as a personal souvenir of his historic effort.

Kilkenney's no-hitter was only the second in the history of the Florida State League and the first for a member of the Daytona Tigers.

The Daytona Tigers are the Class "A" farm club of the Detroit Tigers of the American League and Mike Kilkenney is the leading pitcher on the team.
