

Factory Whistle Again Blowing As New Industry Commences

The whistle at the old factory, which in recent years has been used for vegetable storage, is again sounding. It is used to call over thirty lands to work — twelve men and about twenty girls.

The old factory building is the new vegetable dehydration plant and at present onions are being hydrated, running as powder, kibble and flakes (whole slices). Garlic is to follow shortly, and carrots, celery, cabbage and peppers will all be processed at the plant.

The garlic being used this year was imported from Italy but it is hoped that in future this may be grown on the marsh, or on nearby highland.

Present orders received assure full time operation for the next three months it is estimated, and it is believed that operation will continue for a minimum of six months. The balance of the time will be needed for work on equipment, etc.
