

MRS. HART THOMAS

A lifelong resident of Churchill, Mrs. Hart Thomas died at her home on Saturday, Aug. 25, 1951, in her 82nd year. She had been in failing health for the past eight months.

A music teacher before her marriage, Mrs. Thomas was the former Mary Anne Sloan, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. James Sloan. She was born at Churchill in November, 1869. She married Hart Thomas, who survives her, 48 years ago, and went to live on a farm one mile west of the village. About 16 years ago, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas built a home on Highway 11, near Churchill Orange Hall.

The deceased was a member of the Church of England and was church organist for 13 years and C.G.I.T. leader for 10 years at St. Peter's Church. Secretary-Treasurer of the Women's Association of the church, she was a life member of Churchill Women's Institute, in which she served as secretary for a number of years.

She is survived by her husband, a sister, Mrs. H. Wilson of Toronto, and a brother, Edward Sloan of Churchill.

The funeral service on Monday, August 27, in St. Peter's Anglican Church, was conducted by the Rev. J. W. Newton-Smith. Pallbearers were R. Rogerson, B. Bonney, Wm. Akers, Robert Sinclair, E. Sturgeon and Wm. Paterson. Interment was in the adjoining cemetery.
